The Easter parade is most closely associated with Fifth Avenue in New York City, but Easter parades are held in many other cities. Starting as a spontaneous event in the 1870s, the New York parade became increasingly popular into the mid-20th century—in 1947, it was estimated to draw

over a million people. Its popularity has declined significantly, drawing only 30,000 people in 2008.

In 2020, the Easter parade in Manhattan, New York, was cancelled due to the corona virus pandemic.



Getting Into Alignment

Essentially, wheel alignment is the proper adjustment of the wheels. On most vehicles, there are three adjustment settings: Toe (the amount the fronts of the wheels are closer than the rears), Camber (the inward or outward tilt of the wheel at the top), and Caster (the angle at which the front axles are attached to the vehicle). On some vehicles only one or two of these settings are adjustable. With the introduction of four-wheel independent suspension, many vehicles (MIATA), proper alignment of the rear wheels is as important as it is for the front wheels.

Incorrect Toe and Camber settings will cause tires to wear out prematurely, while an incorrect Caster setting will cause the vehicle to wander and make it feel unstable at high speeds.

If your tires are wearing unevenly, you probably need an alignment. Remember, an alignment will correct what caused your tires to wear unevenly but it will not heal the unevenly worn tires.

insert. MOC is automatically making current subscribers members of the new club until their subscriptions run out.

New members/subscribers will pay \$29 per year for a membership. It appears that direct subscriptions will no longer be available although Miata Magazine will continue to be sold on selected newsstands.

I'm not sure whether the new MOC will honor memberships in MCA. Many MCA members were left high and dry with time running on their memberships but they did not receive the magazines they paid for. If we hear anything on this we'll pass it along.

This looks like a step in the right direction. Local clubs are where most of the action is, but there are some things only a strong national organization can provide. So let's hope the new club has learned from the mistakes of the past and the Miata gets the great national club it deserves.

Cool Running

If your vehicle's engine has an aluminum cylinder head (MIATA), you have all the more reason to have the vehicle's cooling system inspected on an annual basis.

Aluminum heads are more

vulnerable to damage from overheating than the traditional cast iron type. A major repair expense is involved in the event that excessive heat warps the temperature-sensitive heads. And the problem can come on with little warning.

Most commonly overheating develops when there is Investment Banker

a leak in the coolant system. In other cases, a sticking thermostat may be to blame. If so, it may prevent coolant from circulating through the engine.

With all this in mind, it is best to avert costly repairs with inspection. Regularly scheduled maintenance, including changing the coolant, and replacing old hoses can greatly extend the life of your car.

An overheated engine is the most common reason for mechanical breakdown that interrupts vacation travel


