Who was St. Patrick? St. Patrick's Day is celebrated annually on March 17, the anniversary of his death in the fifth century.



The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for over 1,000 years.

On St. Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would

dance, drink and feast-on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at the age of 16. He later

escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people. In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well-known legend of St. Patrick is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.

More than 100 St. Patrick's Day parades are held across the United States; New York City and Boston are home to the largest celebrations.

Getting Into Alignment

Essentially, wheel alignment is the proper adjustment of the wheels. On most vehicles, there are three adjustment settings: Toe (the amount the fronts of the wheels are closer than the rears), Camber (the inward or outward tilt of the wheel at the top), and Caster (the angle at which the front axles are attached to the vehicle). On some vehicles only one or two of these settings are adjustable. With the introduction of four-wheel independent suspension, many vehicles (MIATA), proper alignment of the rear wheels is as important as it is for the front wheels.

Incorrect Toe and Camber settings will cause tires to wear out prematurely, while an incorrect Caster setting will cause the vehicle to wander and make it feel unstable at high speeds.

If your tires are wearing unevenly, you probably need on alignment. Remember, an alignment will correct what caused your tires to wear unevenly but it will not heal the unevenly worn tires.

Here's information from the Appalachian Sports Car Club (ASCC) and the Susquehanna Sports Car Club (SSCC) on this year's Autocross schedule.


Because of construction at the Form Show Complex, the 2001 Autocross Series will be held at the old long term parking lot for the Harrisburg International Airport.

Our Mission: To unite Central Pennsylvania Mazda Miata enthusiasts in a spirit of friendship and to enhance their enjoyment and knowledge of the Miata.

Our History: Back in 1992, Miatas were becoming numerous in the central PA area but there was no Miata club since the short-lived *Keystone Club* had disbanded.

That summer, more Miatacrazed individuals joined the club and after a few local drives—in October of that year—*PACE* took its first run to the Skyline Drive in Shenandoah National Park, VA. PACE membership has continued to grow through the years from this small group to almost one hundred Miatas—and their occupants.

Since then, PACE has explored most of the great and many twisty country



roads in our area and has run trips to various other parts of the country from Ocean City, MD, west to Utah, and from Charleston, SC, north to Nova Scotia. Our events have ranged from scenic drives, picnics and dinners to autocross and performance driving
