- Treasurer's Report. Barry Gotwalt read the report for the period of November 1, 2000 to December 31, 2000. Expenditures totaled \$603.82. Deposits were \$316.00. The beginning balance for 11-1-00 was \$3243.02 and the ending balance on 12-31-00 was \$2955.20. Barry will transfer the books to Sam Henry, incoming Treasurer, when all current expenditures have been cleared.
- Committee Reports
- a. Events Bob Eckels, who was considering taking that position, as amended by the by-laws, had to decline the nomination because of additional responsibilities of his business. Don Newcomer made a motion to continue with the past practice of having the Vice President assume those responsibilities. Randy Chapman, Vice President, agreed.
- Tech Day is still in planning. No additional report was given.
- c. Membership Patty Eckels gave us statistics on membership and the colors of owner's cars. There are currently 122 members owning 127 cars: 114 in PA, 5 in MD, and 3 in WV. 102 members have email addresses. Mailings of our Newsletters via email may be considered at a future time. This would certainly save on printing and postage. Red cars are the most predominant with a total of 33. The year 1999, has the largest representation, with a total of 25. 

MX-5 Racing in the United States



While the United States has the largest group of racing Miatas in the world, there are also a great many in various countries in Europe. Starting with the United Kingdom, an exciting series of races makes MX-5s a popular item.

One such series was the MaX5 Racing Championship. It was Alyn Robson and Jonathan Halliwell in the summer of 2003,

with 2004 as the first full racing season. The plan was to base the series on the original MX-5 Championship that ran in 1990-1991, as well as following the Spec Miata MX-5 Championship in the United States and Canada. According to the founders of the MaX5, their championship series would be based on the plan that close racing is exciting racing and the drivers would be having a grand time of it. Hence the slogan, "Racing to the max!" This series was successful for several years because the entry fees for the racers were cheap and the Mazda MX-5 was a very popular car with the public.

Most of the racing was done on relatively small tracks around the UK, such as

Lydden Hill and Mullory Park, plus an occasional race at Brands Hatch or Silverstone, home of the British Grand Prix. This series also required that drivers who wanted to race in MaX5 Racing Championship join the club for an annual membership fee, and they also had to show an Advanced Racing Driver School license. MaX5 continued through 2008, but in 2009 virtually all of the drivers abandoned it and joined the Mazda racing championship.



Today, the British Racing & Sports Car Club (BRSCC) is the most active racing organization in the UK. And it has a great category for MX-5s, under the heading "racing Mazda MX-5. The affordable was to go racing."



"The BRSCC Mazda MX-5 Championship really is the affordable way to go motor racing and is the perfect starting point for those coming into the sport for the first time. There are a plentiful supply of Mark1s ready to race but even if you want to build your own car, donor cars

are readily available and cheap to buy and convert."

One of the great attributes of the BRSCC is that it makes use of some on the UK's finest racing circuits, including Silverstone, Brands Hatch, Rockingham, and Snetertton. Recently, the BRSCC Championship for Mazda MX-5s featured 60 drivers and regular grids in the mid-30s. Clearly, a healthy racing club.

And a few years ago, the UK company, Jota Sport, put together a Miata MX-5 to compete against more powerful cars in the Britcar MSA British Endurance Championship. With the weight reduced to 850 kilograms and a Mazda engine modified to put out 275 brake horsepower, the Jota Sport MX-5 could hustle from 0 to 60 miles per hour in three seconds and achieve a top speed of 160

miles per hour. Quite remarkable and, as the Jota people say, "The Mazda

MX-5 still remains true to its roots: great handling, huge fun to drive and the ability to challenge bigger, more powerful competition, but an affordable cost."

After putting together the Jota MX-5 racing car, the company then turned its attention to the Jota MX-5 GT, which is a Mazda with 203 brake horsepower and is essentially a



production version of a MX-5 GT concept car shown at the Goodwood Festival of Speed in England.

Throughout Germany, France, Italy, and Spain, where drivers take their sports-car racing seriously, Mazda MX-5s are bound to be involved in one class or another. Because the MX-5 is reasonably priced, can be outfitted with racing necessities by some dealers, and is readily available throughout the continent, there is a lot of interest in these remarkable roadsters.

Australia's MX-5 Cup



Few countries are as gung-ho about sports car racing as Australia, and the MX-5 is a dominant part of this enthusiasm. The Mazda MX-5 Club of New South

Wales (NSW) has recently inaugurated the MX-5 Cup, which consists of five races to be held at the Wakefield Park Raceway over the year. In the words of the NSW Club, "The MX-5 Cup has been created to provide an annual competition featuring low-cost, competitive, good-spirited racing. It is intended to foster the development of MX-5 racing and encourage new entrants to the sport.

Newcomers will be provided support and assistance, and competitors will be expected to adopt a gentlemanly approach to them under race conditions."

To show the level of racing enthusiasm, the MX-5 Club of NSW put out a list of the races and practice days, stretching from early to late November. Thirty-four events are on the list, which goes to show the sports car racing in Australia is very high on the enthusiasts' list of activities.

Not to be outdone are MX-5 enthusiasts in New Zealand. Scads of MX-5s are seen around the two islands that make up the nation, and quite a few of them raced at various circuits around the country.

03.24.14 Twenty-Five Years Later



The 25th anniversary of the Mazda MX-5 Miata has passed, and the celebration now is the next generation version of this remarkable sports car. The New York Auto Show in April 2014 promised a subtle preview of the next Miata MX-5, with the car scheduled to be presented to the public that autumn.

The program manager of the new MX-5

Roadster, Nibuhiro Yamamoto, did mention that rumors that circulated in Europe about the merge of Mazda with Alfa Romeo to build sports cars on the same line was incorrect. And there were many bloggers and journalists who speculated that the MX-5 Miata would use an Alfa Romeo engine. Yamamoto replied, "It is not true. SKYACTIV technology will be adopted for the next Miata model. It will be developed entirely by Mazda."

(And then, to solidify the arrangement, Sergio Marchionne, head of Fiat Chrysler, announced at the Geneva Auto Show in early March that the car that would be done by Mazda in Japan would be a Fiat, not an Alfa Romeo as had been rumored.)

Returning to Yamamoto, and his discussion of the fourth-generation Mazda MX-5 Miata: "Needless to say, we will strengthen its Jinba-ittai (oneness between car and driver) feeling." Yamamoto also said that the fun is not only about

driving but also for many other aspects; therefore, we should call it "lots of fun."

"We have been consistently pursuing those two things as unchanging themes without wavering, and evolved the fun unique to the MX-5 to make it a lightweight sports car which everyone can enjoy from the bottom of his heart, while meeting the social requirements which are much more stringent than 25 years ago." Mr. Yamamoto went on the say, "Make a change in order to preserve. That is the challenge and the mission for engineers. We will proceed together with our fans as we have always done, and the continuing our challenge to pass this model on to the next 25 years and beyond."

The MX-5 25th Anniversary Edition

Yamamoto also has a very clear picture as to how this exciting sports roadster should be sold. The MX-5 25th Anniversary Edition Miata will be limited to 1,000 cars worldwide.

"We owe it to many people around the world who truly enjoy daily life with this model, for the MX-5 being able to celebrate its 25th birthday. Our customers who drive the car, and Mazda as the developer of the model, have together shared the passion for lightweight sports cars over the years and nurtured the dream for it.

"The MX-5 25th Anniversary Edition model we are introducing now was specially developed with Mazda's infinite gratitude for the fans who are the protagonists



of the love story between car and driver over a quarter of a century."

Yamamoto also discussed carefully selecting the pistons, connecting rods, and flywheel to achieve the right balance. "We paid the utmost focus in terms of the weight balance of the moving parts. Needless to say, a very small tolerance is set for the parts in the base model. In order to minimize the weight gap

between the cylinders, those parts used for the piston and connecting rod of the anniversary model were manually selected one by one, thus the weight tolerance is controlled within plus or minus 3 grams, and 1 gram for piston and connecting rod respectively. The weight tolerance for the flywheel is very stringent for the base model already, but again we handpicked more advantageous ones in terms of weight. Our elaborate attention to details realized the outstanding balance and excellent engine feel."

I was also revealed that the 25th anniversary cars would be painted in Soul Red Premium Metallic color. The A-pillar and the header are painted manually in Brilliant Black first, and after they are masked, the body color is painted prior to

returning to the assembly line. "Our passion and the troublesome processes are there, all because this is a very special car to commemorate the 25th anniversary."



Not to be forgotten, the instrumental panel of the Anniversary Miata will be painted in dark red gradation on the base piano black color. The cockpit of the car also has fresh changes, including white leather seats that look great with the Soul Red body paint.

It's quite interesting to notice the dimensions for the 25th Anniversary Edition MX-5 and compare them with a Miata in the US market in 2005.

The overall length of the 25th Anniversary car is 158.0 inches, and the wheelbase measures 91.7 inches. The 2005 model is 155.7 inches long and the wheel is 89.2 inches. Overall width and height for the Anniversary Edition is 167.7 inches and 49.4 inches, compared with 66.0 inches and 48.8 inches in the 2005 Miata. The manual gearbox model tips the scales at 2,593 pounds, while the automatic transmission version weighs 2,619.

With the double-overhead-cam, 2.0-liter, four-cylinder engine with aluminum alloy block and cylinder head, the horsepower for the manual transmission Miata is 167 brake horsepower at 7,000 rpm, while the automatic model has 158 brake horsepower at 6,700 rpm; and both engines put out 140 pounds-feet of torque. Also, the disc brakes on both models are 11.4-inch ventilated front and 11.0-inch solid on the rear discs.

Change to Preserve

As the time grew near to the New York International Auto Show, the new MX-5

management team came forward with an essay titled "Make a Change in Order to Preserve."

"At the New York International Auto Show this year, Mazda displays a bare chassis for the world premiere. Although still in the process of development, the chassis, which has a front midship engine and rear-wheel-drive layout, shows the direction of the next Mazda MX-5. The light weight, 50:50 weight distribution between front and rear, low yaw inertia moment, are all going to be protected as the key principles for Mazda's lightweight sports car. However, that does not necessarily mean the model will not change.

"Over the last 25 years, the times have changed drastically. The awareness for environment and safety has kept growing since the introduction of the first generation and all the way through the model changes to the second and third generations as well. We had to increase the vehicle size and weight in some degree in order to satisfy those requirements.

"But things are much different today compared to the past, and highly sophisticated environmental and safety performance is required now. In a time like this, it needs 'innovation' that goes beyond mere evolution, in order to deliver the fun of owning a true-to-basic lightweight sports car; in other words the oneness between car and driver that can be felt by any drivers, as well as carrying on the excitement of driving on any types of road. That is the meaning of the key word that suggests the direction for the next model, 'make a change in order to preserve.'

"One of the keys to embody it is, needless to say, SKYACTIV technology that has innovated the innovated the basics of automotive technologies. What is at display this time is a totally new SKYACTIV chassis specifically developed for a lightweight sports car. The next model will use this chassis as a foundation, and thoroughly pursuing the 50:50 weight distribution between front and rear, it will continue with light weight and low yaw inertia moment.



At the same time, based on our belief that the original intention of the MX-5 is to deliver the exhilarating feeling of oneness between car and driver, we are meticulously examining the optimal position of a driver with the new chassis, as we see it as an element of 'making a change in order to preserve.'

"Thus we go beyond simply inheriting what earlier generations had, and will realize a dramatic improvement of Jimba-ittai (oneness between car and driver), which is the soul of Mazda.

"Please imagine the next MX-5 based on a bare chassis, which is in the process of development now. And please anticipate the driving feel of a new lightweight sports car which is in the middle of development, along with lots of fun that the owner of this care will be enjoying in life."

The new Mazda MX-5 Miata will be unveiled before the end of the year 2014, and the odds are it will raise a grand rally among sports car enthusiasts who will want to have one. It's clear that much thought and study has gone into the Miata, and despite the arrangement signed with Alfa Romeo, it has been clearly stated that the production line for the Miata will not be used for Alfa Romeo's new sports car. As Mr. Yamamoto told me via email prior to the New York auto show, the Mazda MX-5 will have its own assembly line and the Alfa Romeo will be assembled on a different line.

Mazda is a company with much pride in its products, and the long-term popularity of the MX-5 Miata continues to excite sports car enthusiasts around the globe. With well over 900,000 Miatas have been created and sold over the past 25 years, it is easy to understand the excitement that emanates from Hiroshima, Japan, the home of the Mazda factory. Throughout the Miata's quarter-century history, most sports cars have faded away or sold in relatively small numbers. And while the car market has had its ups and downs, the MX-5 Miata has managed to stay on the list of those who want a reasonably priced roadster that is fun to drive and lives up to its reputation as a remarkable car to buy—new or used.

What's to come???

And then there is the Miata's racing history around the world. In the United States, MX-5 Miata are the most raced cars on the track, participating in a wide variety of associations and on a large number or



racetracks round the United States. And in England, Germany, France, Italy,



Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, and many more nations around the globe, there is always a host of Mazda MX-5s putting on a great show for sports car racing enthusiasts. Plus, on highways and byways, freeways and narrow country roads, Mazda MX-5

Miatas are a common sight—and the drivers always seem to be smiling.
